NGA Position Statement

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Necessity of Collecting Data Regarding Guardianship NGA Position Statement

- Developed in 2024 and voted on by the Board January 2025
- Supports the implementation of standardized data collection practices
- Why care about data?
 - · Improved monitoring and guardianship practices
 - Improve accountability
 - Inform public policy
 - · Support research and education
 - · Supports allocation of resources and funding

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NGA Position Statement Recommendations

- Develop Relevant Data Collection Practices
- Development of Data Collection Hub or Finder
- Incorporation of Best Practices for Data Collection
- Guardianship Court Improvement Programs
- Continuous Evaluation and Policy Influence

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What do courts and guardians have in common?

- · Key role in protecting vulnerable individuals
- More work that can be reasonably managed
- Making sure voices of vulnerable individuals are heard
- Interest in ending unnecessary or overly broad guardianships
- Need for public trust and confidence



Why is data important? Why is monitoring important?

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Purposes of monitoring

- Identify situations when a guardianship may no longer be needed or can be made more limited.
- Identify guardians who are struggling and guide guardians who need assistance in fulfilling their duties, and
- Stop a guardian from using their court appointed authority to abuse, neglect, or exploit an individual.



 - Guardian: nobody read my report

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
